Connecting with Independence Air

Independence Air, the nation's newest name brand in low-fare travel, has begun offering six daily low fare, non-stop, round trip regional jet flights on 50-seat iJets between Louisville International Airport (SDF) and Washington Dulles International Airport (IAD)—serving the metro-Washington, D.C. area.

All flights are now available for sale on the Independence Air website at FLYi.com or by calling toll free 1-800-FLY-FLYI (1-800-359-3594) All fares are sold one-way and a Saturday night stay is NOT required for any fare. Seat assignments can be reserved at the time of booking and flights are not overbooked.

Fares to Washington are low—ranging from just \$69 one-way to no more than \$125. Web users who visit FLYi.com and sign up for a free membership to the iCLUB frequent flyer program will receive an additional \$25 off their first round-trip.

Northup Receives Award (cont ...)

Northup secured over \$75 million from the Federal Aviation Administration to fund the voluntary relocation of 625 airport families, or almost 1/3 of the total airport families eligible for voluntarily relocation, away from aircraft noise. This is the largest amount of funding provided for the relocation program by any elected official since its inception in 1994.

In addition, she has been instrumental in securing funds for numerous airport-related infrastructure improvements. Among them are:

- **West Runway expansion at Louisville International**
- **Apron and taxiway repair at Bowman Field**
- **Taxiway repairs and repaving at Louisville International**
- **Air-rescue fire station at Louisville International**

Traveling Tidbits

■ Enjoy the view

Window Seat, Reading the Landscape From the Air (Chronicle Books) uses satellite photos to explain what you see from the plane. Broken down by region, it details geographical sites and man-made objects. Author Gregory Dicum says the most common question concerns the green circles out West. Just so you know, most of them consist of a well with a long arm that sprays water. Crops grow in circles where the water hits.

■ Suitcase lock passes security

Airport baggage screeners usually cut off locks if they need to search a bag.

However, if the lock is one of the new combination or lock models with a red and white diamond-shaped Travel Sentry logo, screeners can open it without destroying the lock. Locksmiths and Travel Sentry supply screeners with the necessary tool and codes. Locks sell for \$4 to \$10.

■ Implants and security alarms

Implants such as cobalt-chrome hip and knee replacements frequently set off airport metal detectors.

The Transportation Security Administration says that with today's more sensitive equipment, it's very common that people are stopped. Screeners resolve the issue with a hand wand or pat down to determine what triggered the detector. Of people with implants surveyed by United Kingdom researchers, 70 percent say they didn't know that their implant could set off security devices.

Did You Know ...



Travelers not on the curb? Circle the airport and follow the white-and blue triangle Waiting Zone signs to our free, short-term waiting area. The Waiting Zone area is accessible only from the upper (departure) level roadway. However, in the zone you are only a minute away from the arrivals area.

The zone provides a safer and more secure alternative to vehicles waiting curbside or circling the perimeter road. Vehicles in the zone must be attended at all times and may not park for more than one hour. If drivers need access to restrooms, concessions, phones or flight monitors or wish to meet their party in baggage claim, they may park in the Under-4-Hour area in the garage for \$1 for the first hour.
