



July 20, 2009— Vigilant Solution’s Preferred Traveler Program has suspended its operations at Louisville International Airport (SDF).

The suspension at Louisville International follows the June 22, shutdown of operations by Vigilant’s main competitor, Clear. (Clear operated 18 of the 21 airports in the TSA-approved Registered Traveler Program).

By early July, Vigilant had closed its operations in Jacksonville, FL, and the FLO Corporation had shuttered its Registered Traveler Program operation at the Reno-Tahoe International Airport.

Vigilant Solutions began operations at SDF in March 2009. Vigilant’s Preferred Traveler Program, aimed at frequent travelers, provided a dedicated line for its members at security checkpoints.

TSA’s Diamond Self-Select Program

To assist travelers through the security checkpoint, TSA has implemented its Diamond Self-Select program at Louisville International Airport. Look for these icons as you approach the security checkpoint.



Green circle designates the queue for families with small children or passengers with special needs.

Blue square is for casual travelers who aren’t experts and don’t want to be rushed at the checkpoint.

Black diamond is reserved for expert travelers who are very familiar with TSA procedures and always prepared.
