Fact Sheet Waterline Repair Project

On Sunday, October 19, 2014, the main waterline serving Louisville International Airport (SDF) will be shut-off at 9 p.m. and remain off until 4 a.m. on Monday, October 20, 2014, to connect to a newly installed waterline in the Cargo Building Parking Lot. MAC Construction & Excavating of New Albany will perform the work.

With the exception of the Woodford Reserve Bar and Grill (which will close at midnight), all restaurants in the terminal building will close at 8 p.m.

In addition to the passenger terminal at Louisville International Airport (SDF), the following buildings will be impacted:

- LRAA Cargo building
- Customs and Border Protection building
- LRAA Administrative office building
- LRAA Parking Toll Plaza building
- QTA (Quick Turn Around) rental car facility
- Taxicab queuing area

(Buildings **not** affected include the Airport Operations Center, Atlantic Aviation, Compass Airlines hangar, FedEx (both locations), Kentucky Air National Guard, Republic Airways hangar, UPS or the hangars on the east side of the airport.)

During the outage, the following plan is in place for restroom facilities.

To help ensure that travelers on the 18 flights (1,503 seats) scheduled to arrive between 9 p.m. and 11:52 p.m. on Sunday are inconvenienced as little as possible, the Airport Authority has initiated the following:

- Signs will be posted at the entrance of closed restrooms to direct travelers to the next, closest available restroom.
- It is planned that Airport Ambassadors will walk each concourse to answer questions and direct travelers to available restrooms and bottled water.
- Vending machines are, of course, available and bottled water will be distributed by two Airport Ambassadors at the Information Booth, with the support of an onsite Volunteer Coordinator until midnight when the last flight is scheduled to arrive.
- Louisville Metro has been notified and will be on stand-by for emergencies.
