Re: COVID-19 Coronavirus

Today, March 9, 2020, we were notified by Louisville Metro Public Health and Wellness (LMPHW), that the individual identified as the first person in Jefferson County, Kentucky to test positive for the COVID-19 Coronavirus recently traveled through Louisville Muhammad Ali International Airport (SDF) (February 28th late evening, March 2nd early morning and March 6th late evening). We will work closely with LMPHW, any other supporting agencies, and your company moving forward. With this information available, if your company has any corporate protocols relative to this situation, you may wish to implement as you deem appropriate. Based on the information available at this time, the LMPHW has indicated the risk of exposure remains low.

We take health concerns seriously and follow the guidance provided by public health officials at the federal, state, and local levels. And because of this, we felt it was imperative that we share this information with you directly as soon as possible.
